Get a FREE Metro Pass and Dump the Pump!

On **Thursday, June 19, 2008**, Metro joins the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) and other transit agencies nationwide to celebrate the third annual National Dump the Pump Day. Dump the Pump Day is designed to encourage people to get out of their cars and walk, bike or use public transportation to conserve fuel and reduce the environmental impact of everyday commuting. Locally, Metro is teaming with [Trailnet](#) and the [St. Louis Bicycle Federation](#) to encourage people to Dump the Pump.

Each year, public transportation use in the U.S. saves 1.4 billion gallons of gasoline - almost 4 million gallons of gasoline per day, and reduces the nation's carbon emissions by 37 million metric tons annually - equivalent to the electricity used by 4.9 million households. Since January 2003, gas prices have increased by more than 150 percent. With fuel costs continuing to rise, Dump the Pump Day presents a great opportunity for commuters to try Metro and see how it can be an economical and convenient transportation option.

“By participating in Dump the Pump Day, we hope people who have never used Metro will decide to give us a try instead of driving their car,” say Robert Baer, President and CEO of Metro. “We welcome new riders and thank our regular riders for continuing to choose Metro.”

As an incentive for St. Louis area commuters to get out of their vehicles and try transit, Metro is offering a **FREE ONE-DAY PASS** for Dump the Pump Day. The Free One-Day Pass is valid for **Thursday, June 19th only**, and allows commuters to try MetroBus and MetroLink for the entire day. **Commuters must have their pass with them to ride free on Dump the Pump Day.**

The Downtown MetroRide Center is located inside America's Center at 7th & Washington in downtown St. Louis, and the Clayton MetroRide location is on the Second Level of the Clayton MetroBus Transfer Center/MetroLink Station at 232 S. Meramec Ave., between Meramec and Central avenues. Both Centers are open 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays.

Metro will distribute passes at the Metro Information Table at the St. Louis Galleria on Saturday, June 14th from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
